Violence, ePub, 2016</u>: This study explores the prevalence rate and characterises the nature of sexual abuse among individuals with severe mental illnesses who were under psychiatric care in three different inpatient facilities. <u>Labelling sexual victimization experiences: the role of sexism, rape myth acceptance, and tolerance for sexual harassment. LeMaire K.L, Oswald D.L, Russell B.L. Violence Vict. ePub, 2016</u>: This study investigates whether attitudinal variables, such as benevolent and hostile sexism toward men and women, female rape myth acceptance, and tolerance of sexual harassment are related to women labelling their sexual assault experiences as rape. Violence against women, ePub, 2016</u>: This study presents the Sex Trafficking Attitudes Scale (STAS), assessing cognitive, behavioural, and affective attitudes toward the sex trafficking of women and girls. <u>Underreporting makes sexual violence at work difficult to address, NPR News, 23 February 2016</u>: There are no recent, reliable statistics about sexual violence at work. The most recent data from the Bureau of Justice Statistics estimated there were more than 43,000 workplace rapes and sexual assaults a year. But anti-rape advocates say that vastly underreports the crimes, because many victims are afraid to or discouraged from coming forward.

El Salvador creates court for violent crimes against women amid surge in violence, International Business Times, 23 February 2016: A high number of crimes against women — including femicide, sexual assault and domestic abuse — in El Salvador has led the country to create a special court specifically to try the violent crimes, TeleSur TV reported.

<u>Doctors push controversial strategy to fight female genital mutilation, Women's eNews, 22</u> <u>February 2016</u>: Two doctors are advocating for a different approach to lower global rates of female genital cutting, still common in some regions although banned in numerous countries.

SRSG commends Indonesia for its strong commitment to ending violence against children, SRSG eNews , 19 February 2016: The Special Representative of the Secretary-General on Violence against children, Marta Santos Pais congratulated Indonesia for adopting a national strategy for the elimination of violence against children and a national action plan on child protection which together provide a comprehensive framework to prevent and respond to incidents of violence.

In India, schoolgirls look forward to self-defence classes, Women's eNews, 15 February 2016: In response to growing national attention to the problem of rape in India, the government issued a directive encouraging all public and private schools to train female students in self-defence.
