

Call for Expressions of Interest for Principal Investigator and national researchers

All Survivors Project (ASP) is planning a multi-site study on sexual violence against boys, men and LGBTI populations from conflict and humanitarian settings in Afghanistan, Central African Republic and Syria in order to identify gaps and opportunities in service provision and barriers to accessing services among all survivors. The study's goal is to enhance evidence-based and survivor centered responses for all survivors.

APS is seeking expressions of interest from researchers to help us undertake the research as survivor centered, safe and ethical and accountable to women and girl survivors in these settings. We hope to learn from others doing similar work with survivors in humanitarian settings, and to innovate upon tested methods to ensure this new research follows the highest standards of scientific rigor, adds to collective knowledge and builds upon feminist approaches to research with survivors.

We will engage a Principal Investigator to shape and lead the research overall, and National Researchers with experience working with survivors in the local language and among local populations. We expect the Principal Investigator will have extensive experience designing and undertaking research on conflict related sexual violence, implementing international ethical and safety standards, and leading teams of local researchers. We expect the National Researchers will have some experience with research on sexual and gender-based violence in humanitarian settings a deep understanding of local contexts.
