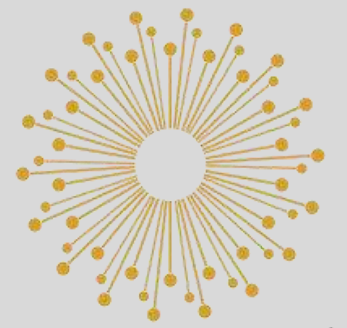

- Leverage strategic partnerships

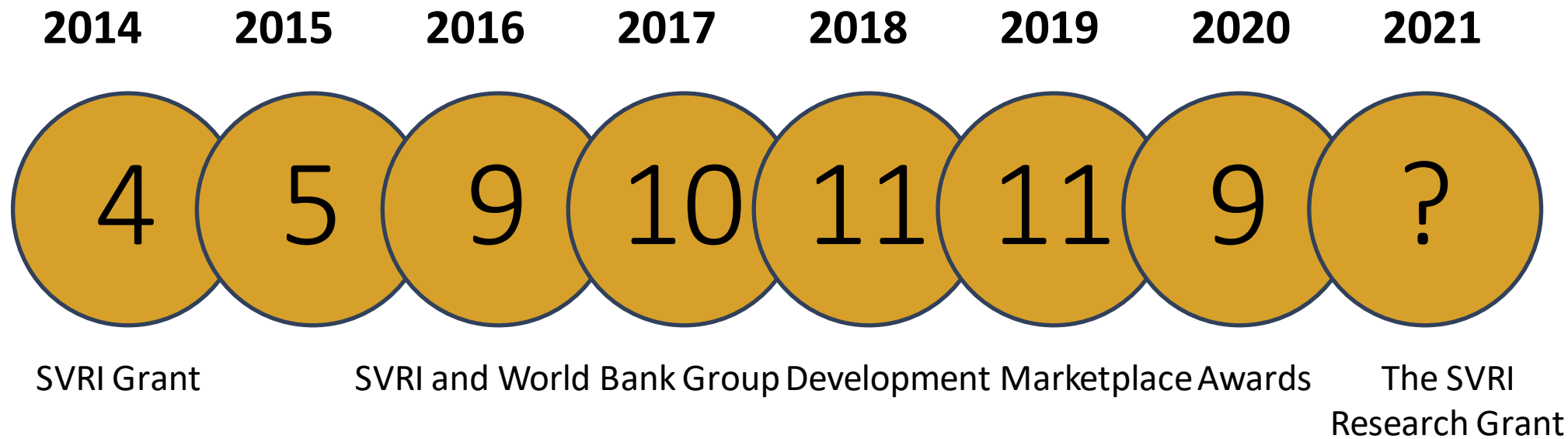
STRENGTHEN CAPACITY

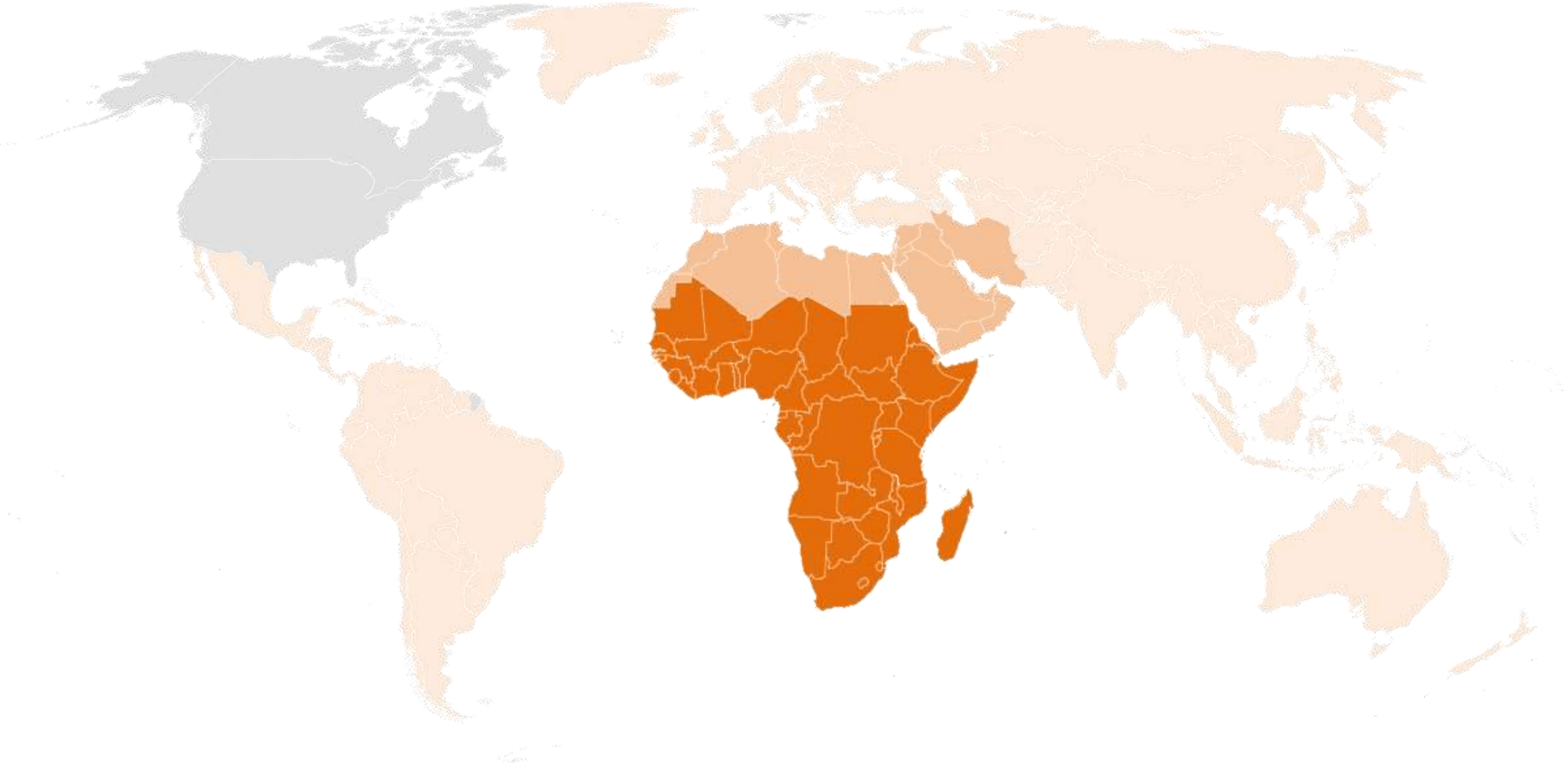

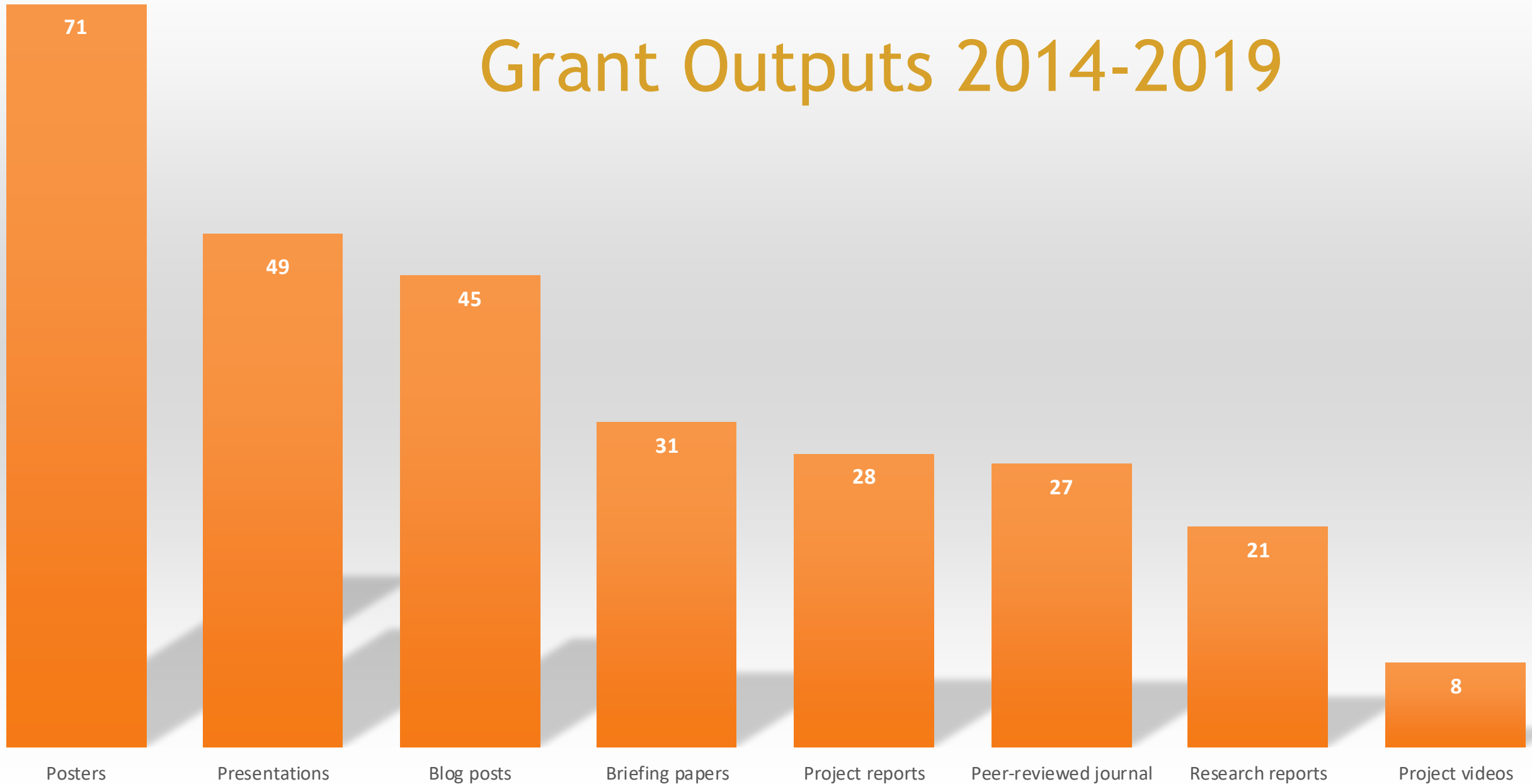
