What is practice-based knowledge?

*Practice-based knowledge is the cumulative knowledge and learning acquired by practitioners through years of innovation, reflection, and refinement. It includes insights gained from observations, conversations, direct experience, and programme monitoring. – Prevention Collaborative*

*Practice-based learning as the cumulative journey of intentional learning over time, informed by insights gained from direct experiences, observations, stories, informal reflections, monitoring processes, and more. – Raising Voices*



*PBK is an evolving concept*

*Centres learning insights of those working on the ground in communities*

*Aims to complement and not contradict or replace other forms of knowledge*

*Often informal and collected in informal ways*

*Faith communities are diverse – PBK allows for reflection on the specificities of cultural, religious and social contexts impacts how interventions play out.*

*PBK helps translate policy commitments into approaches that resonate within faith settings*

*PBK helps capture the pioneering work done by practitioners working at the intersections of faith and VAW/C*

*PBK helps reveal what is unique about the intersections of faith & VAW/C*
